

Madison Suburban Utility District – Notice to Businesses Reopening

If your business has been closed due to Safer-At-Home, and is preparing to reopen, we recommend you flush your private water lines that serve water to your business. Private lines are those after the water meter. It is important to flush your system as stagnation of water from non-use can result in deteriorated water quality. Remember, flushing your private water lines and equipment that uses water will ensure good water quality.
